The music intern is welcome to leave as soon as they have finished supper and put away any music related equipment, sheet music and books. They will not be paid for any additional time they are present at the Gathering after 7 p.m. No Gathering services are held on the Easter and Thanksgiving weekends or during the Christmas break. The Music Intern will also not be required to play at services held during the exam periods.
